Malloy's Building Renovation – 1998

Malloy's Building, now known as Hudson Corners, was renovated in 1998, with the oversight of the Stony Point Planning Board. The building, built in the 1860s, once served as Town Hall and was awarded a County Executive Preservation Award by the Historical Society of Rockland County for work done by the town and the building owner. The Malloy's Building is home to four Stony Point businesses and four apartments upstairs. The building is also recognized as a local "Place of Distinction" in our Town Master Plan.



2008 - NYSDOT Bridge Plans Can Save Historic Building

Replacement of the Farley Bridge by the NYSDOT threatens to demolish the Malloy Building and the very center of our small downtown. In reply to public outcry against the demolition of the building in 2007 the DOT revised its plans in 2008. The revised plans expand the width of the bridge and intersection, while making substantial traffic improvements and saving the historic landmark and downtown businesses.
